We are truly blessed and grateful to Roger Bowman for sharing his spiritual guidance for our Holy Lament Service. We found that God takes our grief and disappointment and transforms them into holy joy and renewed hope. Thank you to Donna Ahrens and Martin Hinkley for leading our weekly hymn.

The first week we reflected about "What is Lament?" We shared our emotions and thoughts that come to mind when we hear the world lament. The Bible is filled with examples of faithful people offering up sorrowful or even angry prayers to God. During Lent we explored some laments found in scripture and relearned the discipline and the gift of holy lament.

Our second week we turn to the so called "Little Laments", those things that we grieve which, in the grand scheme of life, may feel small but hurt. These little laments can start to add up and no longer be so little. When we offer our little griefs to God, we can discover that He has space even for the non-earth-shattering hurts and prepares us to turn over the big laments to Him,

Then we turned our attention to the "**Big Laments**" or "**Laments from the Depths**" that are a part of every believer's life. No grief or sorrow is too great for our God who so loved this world. We reflected on what helpful thing that someone has said or done for us when we were facing a time of deep grief and mourning and how we felt or experienced God's presence in these times of lament and sorrow.



Week four, we shared our "**Individual Laments**". If a loss is deeply personal, those around us may be touched by the sadness, disappointment, or loss. Sharing our laments in a Christian community, helps to drive away fear and sorrow as it strengthens our hope. And during our Lenten "fasting" we should:

- Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
- Fast from worries and have trust in God.
- Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.
- · Fast from pressures and be prayerful.

Our final devotion focused on "**Communal Laments**". Meaning grief encountered by a group of people. Sometimes disasters strike not just one person or household, but a whole community or even an entire nation. At such times we can find strength in coming together to mourn, raising our collective voices in a loud cry to God. Communal lamenting can help us work our way through time of natural disasters or destruction due to human violence.

So, what is Lament?

A lament is a prayer expressing sorrow, pain or confusion. It is the way Christians process grief in God's presence. When we bring our laments to God and ask, even beg Him to intervene, because He is just, faithful and keeps His promises and we turn to hope. During Lent, we must remember Jesus. He is not only a model of lament but our greatest joy that one day lament will be no more. "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain." Revelation 21:4

He has risen, He has risen indeed!
