Where are We Going?

At Coffee & Conversation on Sunday, February 18, the question was asked "Where are we going?" led by our council president Tim Heffner.

Highlights of the discussion:

- Church Council had an extensive discussion with Pastor Lang at his exit interview. He highlighted the strengths and weakness of our congregation from his perspective. The strengths and weaknesses he identified were consistent and in agreement with Church Council.
- Information in the exit interview will be validated or changed based on information collected in the Mission Site profile.
- Pastor Lang also commented that seeing every comment in the Mission Site profile, when he arrived, helped him be prepared to minister to our congregation and address concerns proactively.

Current Status of Pastors

- Donna Locke has worked with the Synod staff to schedule pastors in place for worship. The synod allows us to work up to 6 weeks ahead of our need. Donna is being proactive and several pastors have willingly agreed to serve, including pastors in our congregation.
- The Synod Coordinator implied that she had 2 good candidates for the interim position. Both declined. She has moved to a new role in the synod.



- Drew Neidig was also recommended as a potential interim pastor. He has taken on a new role with the synod and will be assisting us in finding an interim pastor. Tim will be in communication with him to discuss our vacancy.
- We must be actively involved in the process and reach out to other synods to fill both the interim role and the permanent role. We need to be the advocates for our congregation and market ourselves to potential pastors.

What can we do as a congregation to find get an interim and permanent pastor?

- **Proactively market our congregation**. Everything we do needs to show we are ready, willing, and highly attractive to a candidate. We must document all the things we are doing, showcase the involvement of the congregation and consider every interaction with a supply pastor as an opportunity to attract a permanent pastor. Our supply pastors are communicating with the synod and other pastors and can help us attract a permanent candidate.
- With many congregations looking for a pastor, we must be more active and involved in the process to become more visible. The synod has indicated that finding a permanent pastor may be a long process.
- We will need to fill out a Mission Site Profile and it was decided it would be good to put a team into place to accomplish the profile. In order to accomplish this profile, a survey will be sent to all our members. It will ask what you are looking for in a pastor and what are the needs of our church and its members.

Communication is the key! Keeping the congregation informed throughout the process. Be persistent with the synod. And pray!

Launched in 2003, National MS Education and Awareness Month is observed in March of each year, a nationwide effort by MS Focus: The Multiple Sclerosis Foundation and

affiliated groups to raise the public's awareness of multiple sclerosis. The vital goals of this campaign are to promote an understanding of the scope of this disease, and to assist those with MS in making educated decisions about their healthcare.

Multiple sclerosis is a disease that impacts the brain and spinal cord which make up the central nervous system and controls everything we do.

MS is an autoimmune inflammatory condition affecting approximately 400,000 in the United States and two and a half million people worldwide. MS symptoms can range from mild to severe, since MS is unpredictable and often varies from person to person. Symptoms may include numbness to the limbs, paralysis or loss of vision.

Today, there have been great advances in MS research and new treatment options that provide hope to those with this disease.

Maintaining good health is important for people with MS. This includes proper nutrition, exercise, emotional health.

There are many ways to support MS research and awareness like MS events, and staying informed.



Then we will turn to the


